### Grant Round 23 (2024 Awards)

On March 15 LCHIP opened its 23rd grant round. Prospective applicants must submit a Letter of Intent (LOI) through LCHIP's online grant management portal between March 15 and May 22, 2024. LCHIP staff review each submission for compliance with eligibility requirements and all eligible projects are invited to submit a complete application, due June 19, 2024. Over the summer, a panel comprised of volunteers knowledgeable in various aspects of natural- and historic-resource conservation will review each proposal and project site to gain a better understanding of each proposal. LCHIP's

Board of Directors considers the recommendations of these panels when making final funding decisions in November. With grant funding tied to the number of real estate transactions taking place in the state, LCHIP is anticipating available grant funds to be far below the most recent 5-year average and another highly competitive grant cycle.

### **Stewardship**

Upon completion of an LCHIP-funded project, grant recipients enter into a long-term agreement with LCHIP which requires responsible stewardship of the benefitting property. Stewards report to LCHIP annually on the condition and uses of the properties. In Q3, FY24 LCHIP staff reviewed 335 Annual Monitoring Reports documenting property inspections conducted in CY2023 and awarded \$170,250 in stewardship grants to 145 reporting organizations.

In CY 2024, LCHIP will have 375 properties under stewardship.
